Section C – Personal Writing

- You will be given a Personal Writing topic and asked to write an engaging essay. [20 marks]

You will be assessed using the following success criteria:

- Use persuasive language techniques.
- Be engaging for the reader.
- Include a range of punctuation, used accurately.
- Use high level vocabulary.
- Spelling should be as accurate as possible.
- Use paragraphs.
